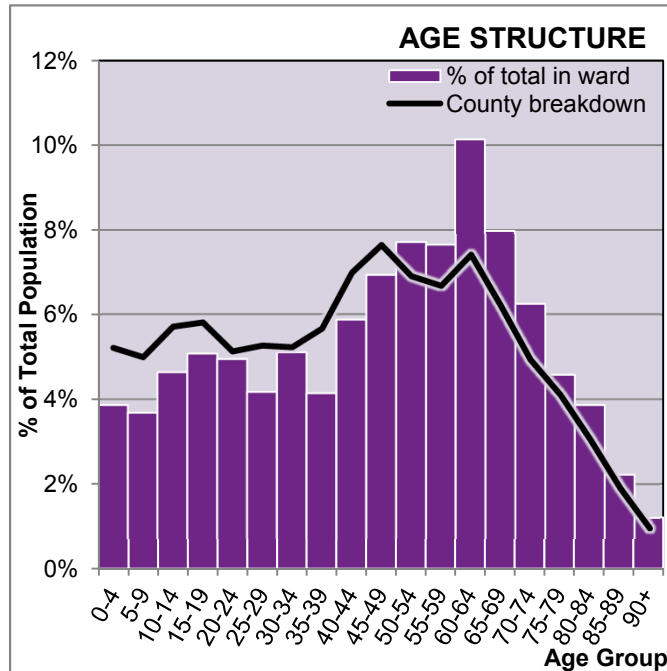

There is no age limit applied to the definition of a **child**. For example, a couple living with their son aged 40 would be classified as a family consisting of a couple and their child unless the son has a partner or child living in the household. A **dependent child** is a person aged 0 to 15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16 to 18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.

NATIONAL STATISTICS SOCIO-ECONOMIC CLASSIFICATION (NS-SEC)

table KS611

The NS-SEC provides an indication of socio-economic position based on occupation. Whereas 'Occupation' (see table on previous page) only includes people in employment, the NS-SEC categories include unemployed people (except the long-term unemployed and those who have never worked); retired people; those looking after a home; those on government employment or training schemes; and people who are sick or disabled. The normal procedure is to classify these people according to their last main job.
